Kings Park Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Kings Park Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2024. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school this support has allowed us to offer a wider variety of subjects and special curriculum experiences including - iPads and tablets, smart boards, coding and Robotics, Mathletics, Get Epic, cooking and gardening, life skills and whole school activities such as Carnival and School Performance.

Families are requested to arrange payment of \$150 per child to cover the cost of all items that are required throughout the year. **PLEASE NOTE: Cash or Eftpos are accepted as payment**.

To ensure all school incursions, excursions, sports and special activities are affordable for all families the cost is subsidised by the school. Families will be required to pay the balance of the activity cost. For those families that are eligible for the Camps, Sports & Excursion Fund (holders of a current health care/pension card) you will be able to apply for funding to assist with cost of these activities listed. You will need to bring your Health Care Card or Pension Card (valid on the 29th January 2024) on this day so that the appropriate forms may be completed.

Refunds: Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-by-case basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for noncurriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

 Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a
 confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
